## Word Study Pattern, Week of January $25^{\text {th }}-29^{\text {th }}$

Pattern: The letter "c" can make a hard ("k") or soft ("s") sound. If the " $c$ " is in front of the vowels " $a$," "o," or " $u$," it will usually make the hard ( $k$ ) sound. If the " $c$ " is in front of "e," "i," or " $y$," it will usually make the soft (s) sound.

Examples: cat $\rightarrow$ hard $c$ (sounds like $k$ ) because it is before an " $a$ " city $\rightarrow$ soft $c$ (sounds like s) because it is before an "i" cent $\rightarrow$ soft $c$ (sounds like s) because it is before an "e" recycle $\rightarrow$ soft $c$ (sounds like s) because it is before a " $y$ "
